Square Footage Fees

A membership entitles you to receive water service from the Fruitland Mutual Water Company. The membership fee applies to the first 2000 square feet of enclosed, roofed, or covered area of structures on your property. Any area above the 2000 square feet or additional structures on the same property will be subjected to the \$2.50 per square foot assessment. If a building permit is required, the permit will provide the square footage in which the assessment will be based. The square footage policy has been in effect since 1983, and is set forth in the bylaws of the Fruitland Mutual Water Company. A Word from Our General Manager



Besides being an evergrowing water system with new mains, services, and hydrants, Fruitland Water has many miles of aging water lines. The company got started in 2016 replacing 1,000 feet of AC or Transite pipe. This work is being done by the Fruitland Water crew, who, this year, has replaced about 2,000 feet of main and is now working on the services on the same section of main. The members in

the area have been great to work with, given that we are digging through their front yards within the county right of way. Pierce County is, in most cases, having the water company stay within 2-3 feet of the existing pipelines which keeps the new lines within right of way but does create challenges with mature landscaping. The company still has about 24 miles to go. Thanks again to the members who were so

patient in working with us this last summer. This winter, staff will be out checking for proper operation of fire hydrants, clearing around meter boxes, and valve exercising. If you have concerns about any sensitive vegetation near your service meter box please let us know ahead of time so we can coordinate efforts with you.
