Square Footage Fees

A membership entitles you to receive water service from the Fruitland Mutual Water Company. The membership fee applies to the first 2000 square feet of enclosed, roofed, or covered area of structures on your property. Any area above the 2000 square feet or additional structures added on the same property will be subjected to the \$2.50 per square foot assessment. If a building permit is required, the permit will provide the square footage in which the assessment will be based. The square footage policy has been in effect since 1983, and is set forth in the bylaws of the Fruitland Mutual Water Company. The City of Puyallup is moving forward with the next phase of 39th AVE SW, from the 1100 block to 17th ST SW (86th AVE E). Fruitland Water will be replacing water main, and relocating fire hydrants and services.

Current Construction Projects

- * Robbins Hollow is a new housing development under construction located at 407 23rd Ave SE. The project will consist of duplexes and fourplexes totaling 84 new connections (services).
- * Arsland Estates is another housing development under construction located at 13th St SW and 28th Ave Ct SW. This development will have 18 new connections (services).
- * For a new commercial project we will be servicing the Brown Bear car wash at Meridian & 118th St E.

Water Conservation

During the winter months, pipes have the possibility to freeze. This cannot only be an inconvenience to homeowners, but a frozen water pipe can become expensive. When the winter months come around, it is wise to follow some easy precautions that can potentially keep a homeowner from the hassle of replacing a water pipe. When the weather starts to make the shift to colder weather, make sure that any hoses that are connected to the house are unscrewed and are allowed to drain. If the water were to freeze overnight, not only could the gardening hose be ruined, but the pipe connected to the hose could also freeze and cause the pipe to burst. Simply taking off the hose and allowing the pipe to drain could help. Another good tip for homeowners would be to insulate any exposed pipes. For example, if there is any pipe in an attic, crawl space and/or basement that doesn't have an insulator, there could be a possibility of the pipe freezing. Cross-Connection Survey

The Washington State Department of Health requires all public water systems to maintain a Cross Connection Control Program. A cross connection is any actual or potential physical connection between a potable water line and any pipe, vessel, or machine containing a nonpotable fluid or gas, such that it is possible for the nonpotable fluid, solid or gas to enter the water system by backflow. As part of Fruitland Water's Cross Connection Control Program, we survey all customers/service connections no less than every three years to determine if a potential cross connection exists. Fruitland water extends our gratitude to all our customers for taking the time to fill out the survey. Your efforts are an important part in continuing to maintain a safe and reliable drinking water supply.

COMING...PREPARE NOW!

Now is a good time to check your home and prepare for the winter weather. A few steps can eliminate trouble later:

 For extremely cold weather, wrapping or covering spigots, hose bib, is prudent.



- Be sure to know where your shut-off valve is located.
- If you will be out of the area for a prolonged period of time, you may want to contact the Fruitland Water office staff and request to have your water meter service turned off until you return.
