Development Construction

Fruitland Mutual Water Company constructs all water system improvements that we will maintain. All fees and charges must be paid in full before approval for construction will be sought from the Board of Directors and construction can be initiated. Fruitland Water employees or a contractor hired by Fruitland Water shall install all waterlines within the Fruitland Water service area. The construction scheduling is based upon who pays all fees and charges first. Construction of water system improvements will not commence until the area around the improvements is to subgrade, and construction staking is in place per Fruitland standards.

Water Availability Letters

The fee for Water Availability Letters is \$50.00, payable upon application. Issuance should be made within 7 to 10 business days. Fees for water service connections are due and payable at the time the Water Availability Letter is released for building permit applications. Developments require payment before any construction commences.

Cross Connection Control

Fruitland Mutual Water Company complies with the requirements of WAC 246-290-490 for Cross Connection Control. All required backflow assemblies must be installed within 18" of the meter tail, separated with a union between them. All commercial water services must be protected with at least an approved Double Check Valve Assembly (DCVA). Properties or uses listed in Table 9 of WAC 249-290-490, or where a higher hazard is potential or exists as determined by a Cross Connection Control Specialist (CCS), must install a Reduced Pressure Backflow Assembly (RPBA). Meters serving more than one commercial unit must also have a Reduced Pressure Backflow Assembly (RPBA). All fire services (inside and outside the City) must

be protected with a Double Detector Check Valve Assembly (DDCVA). All installations must be installed pursuant to the City of Puyallup Standard Detail 309 (DCVA), 310 (RPBA) or 311 (DDCVA) and/or all applicable details.

All backflow assemblies must be tested by a Backflow Assembly Tester certified in the state of Washington by the Department of Health. All assemblies must be tested after installation (before service commences) and annually thereafter (to retain water service).

All Cross Connection Control measures are installed by the owner/developer of the property and retained property of the owner. All installation and testing costs are the responsibility of the owner of property. No backflow assembly may serve more than one property.

Fire Services

Fire services are not mains of the Fruitland Mutual Water Company. These private lines commence at the valve on the water main. Wet-taps will be provided by Fruitland Water when connecting valves do not exist. All installation and inspection costs shall be borne by the owner.

On commercial jobs we install, typically there are connections for the project that supplies water for the interior fire suppression system. The tees, tapping sleeves, or valves serve no purpose to enhance the operation or service of the water system, they just are solely for the fire line. Like a water meter, the company's ownership stops after the valve and we do not lay any of the fire line past that point, but we do maintain the valve. *Charges for tapping sleeves, tees, and/or valves may apply to the developer/owner.*

Hydrant Meter Rental

Fruitland Mutual Water Company requires hydrant meters to be used whenever bulk water is being used on a job site. The water usage on the meter will be charged at tier one of the Fruitland Mutual Water Company's current tiered rate structures. A rental deposit will be paid before the meter can be issued. When the meter is returned if the difference is less than the deposit, a check will be made out to the renter of the meter and will be available and ready for pickup or mailed to the renter on the first business day after the 5th of each month or the third Tuesday of each month. If the balance is more, the renter of the meter will be charged for the difference.
